9. Report from District Councillor.
As Cllr Betson was newly elected on 4th May she has nothing to report but thanked those present for their support and looked forward to working for the benefit of the Parish.
10. Report from County Councillor.
Cllr M Smith confirmed that the number of County Councillors has now reduced from 69 to 61.
Eltisley is in the Papworth/Swavesey ward which covers 13 Parishes.
CCC has a budget of £550 million for 2017/18.
Reorganisation is ongoing to save money these changes are mainly to the back office.
There is a fund for Parishes to apply to if they feel that a service can best be delivered at a local level.
Mental health awareness is a priority with much information being available on CCC website.

A resident thanked Cllr Smith for all of her hard work. She reiterated that she is there to serve the residents and any issues she is always happy to meet and discuss.

11. Report from Eltisle Cricket Club

12. Public Open Forum.

A resident asked if the damaged goal post on The Green could be replaced.

Chairman replied that the matter was on the agenda for EVGT. He was also aware that there may be funding from W.I and the F.A.

A second resident spoke to say that vehicles were driving around the bollards on cross path to avoid the width restrictions. This comment was supported by a second resident who was aware of this happening near the church.

Cllr Pinner said that the matter would be kept under review.

A Weldon asked Cllr Smith if her request to paint the bollards to aide visibility had been approved.

A third resident spoke about a request to light the children's play area a matter he had also raised a The Cade AGM. He felt this would aide safety and extend the use fo the facilities in Spring/Autumn.

Cllr Pinner confirmed that the matter was on the agenda for the Parish Council meeting after the APM.

Cllr Pinner spoke stating there had been much correspondence regarding the proposed development in the village and expressed his surprise that nobody had spoken on the issue. A resident did reply that the Council had made its position clear in that it would not be commenting until the application was received. Cllr Pinner confirmed the legal position and need to deal with in a correct manner without any pre determination.

The Clerk was asked to explain the calling of an Extra Ordinary meeting and Parish Poll. She also confirmed that it was possible to ask for an extension to the consultation period for a planning application from SCDC which may or may not be approved.
